### Youth Services Program

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Youth Services is a life skills program for youth who may have emotional, social, behavioral or mental health issues and may be involved in the Youth Criminal Justice system.

#### KEY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Working with youth, ages 12-18, who may display one or all of the above mentioned issues.
- Responsibility for creating and facilitating life skills workshops to groups of youth at the Surrey Youth Resource Centers.
- Responsibility for creating and implementing strategies designed to work toward individual client goals such as the development of social and life skills, communication skills, behaviour management skills and increased independence.
- Responsibility for scheduling, report writing and maintaining contact with probation officers and other community professionals.
- Monitoring (Youth Justice) clients including curfew and bail checks.
- Some weekends and evenings included.
- Working with Youth on probation helping them to comply with probation conditions and set and achieve life goals.
- Writing reports for Probation officers and possible submission to courts.
- Attending court both to support Youth and to report on compliance
- Facilitating workshops for parents in the community.

#### QUALIFICATIONS

##### Education, Training, and Experience:

- Bachelor degree in a related field. Consideration will be given to other related education and experience.

##### Job Skills and Abilities:

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Excellent time management and organizational skills
- Direct working experience with at risk youth involved in the criminal justice system
