QUALIFICATIONS

Education, Training, and Experience

The candidate must have:

- M.A., M.Ed., M.S.W.,
- A minimum of three to five years' experience providing direct clinical supervision to staff engaged in delivering services within a feminist framework working with women and children affected by violence: previous clinical experience working with issues such as domestic violence and sexual abuse and the resulting trauma.
- Affiliation with a recognized professional body (BCACC)
- Satisfactory Criminal Record Check.
