Our professional therapists provide assessment, short-term counselling, and support to individuals, and families in Surrey. They will guide and support you in creating and sustaining constructive changes in behaviour and belief systems.

The Family Therapist will provide clinical counselling services to those who are referred by the Ministry of Children and Family Development or internal OCS program.

HIGHLIGHTS OF KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develops and implements therapeutic service plans and programs necessary to meet client goals and objectives.
- Provides individual and group counselling implementing intervention strategies consistent with client information and goals. Working in collaboration with client to establish goals that are relevant, clear and concrete. Organizing, recognizing, and relaying appropriately the implications of case material.
- Appropriately administers assessments to determine client concerns, problems and case outcomes. Specifying case outcomes early and concretely.
- Maintains client and service records.
- Provides consultation to those working with client cases; i.e. social workers, probation officers, other organization staff, and other professionals.
- Provides follow-up support to clients after the end of therapy treatment. Monitors and evaluates clients' functioning and interaction with family and social supports in the community. Advises other professionals involved with client's case where further evaluation or more intensive treatment is required.

- Ability to work independently and as a member of a professional team.
