The Intensive Support and Supervision Program provides 1-1 mentorship and education support to youth that have criminal justice involvement. Youth Justice workers connect individuals to services such as prosocial activities, health supports, education resources and legal supports to youth that may have emotional, social, behavioral and mental health issues.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Working with youth aged 12-18 who may display one or all of the above-mentioned issues.
- Providing one to one outreach support to youth in the community
- Responsible for creating and implementing strategies designed to work toward individual client goals such as
 the development of social and life skills, communication skills, behavior management skills and increase
 independence.
- Responsibility for scheduling, report writing and maintaining contact with Probation Officers and other community professionals
- Writing reports for Probation Officers and possible submission to courts
- Establish a positive rapport and working relationship with youth and parents/guardians while modeling positive, appropriate behavior
- Working with youth on Probation, helping them to comply with probation conditions and set and achieve life goals.
- Attend court, to support youth and to report on compliance.
- Weekends and evenings may be required

Education, Training, and Experience:

- Bachelor degree in Criminology, Criminal Justice or a related field. Consideration will be given to other related education and experience.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Current First Aid certificate.
