

BUILDING CUSTODIAN REGULAR FULL TIME 35-40 hours per week

Options Community Services is looking for a Building Custodian to join our team at Habitat 81st. Located at the corner of King George Blvd. and 81st Avenue, Habitat@81st provides 100 units of low income, and market rental housing in a state-of-the-art community-based living hub. As a Building Custodian, you will be responsible for maintaining the cleanliness of the two office floors, performing routine inspections, and ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for both staff and clients.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Performing routine cleaning tasks, including but not limited to sweeping, mopping, dusting, and vacuuming, to maintain a clean and sanitary environment.
- Cleaning and disinfecting restrooms and replenish supplies as needed.
- Emptying trash receptacles and ensuring proper disposal of waste.
- Monitoring and maintaining inventory of cleaning supplies, notifying the supervisor when reordering is necessary.
- Reporting any maintenance or repair issues to the Manager.
- Assisting in setting up for events and meetings as needed.
- Following established safety procedures and protocols.

The successful candidate will be responsible for the cleanliness and maintenance of our facility during daytime hours. This position involves a variety of custodial tasks to uphold our high standards and provide an exceptional experience for our community.

Qualifications:

A minimum of one (1) year experience in a custodial or janitorial role. The successful candidate possesses a strong sense of responsibility and takes pride in maintaining a clean and orderly environment. They will have knowledge of Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHIMS). They are proactive, detail-oriented and capable of working independently or a part of a team.

The successful incumbent will be physically capable of performing all assigned duties that may include walking, standing, reaching, lifting, carrying equipment or moving furniture.

This is a non-unionized position with a pay range of \$23-\$27. Advancement in salary is dependent on successful performance, and established OCS funding and pay policies.
